Oldsmar City Officials Endorse Ed Hooper

Oldsmar —Ed Hooper, candidate for Florida Senate, received the endorsement of every elected official in the city of Oldsmar during an event at the Suegra Tequila Cantina restaurant in the Oldsmar Town Center this week. Among those in attendance were Oldsmar Mayor Doug Bevis, Vice Mayor Dan Saracki, and Council Member Eric Seidel, all of whom are endorsing Ed in his State Senate District 16 race.

He and his wife Lee live in Clearwater. They have four children and ten grandchildren. Florida Senate District 16 includes northern Pinellas County and southwestern Pasco County. Other recent endorsements include State Senators Jack Latvala, Jeff Brandes and Dana D Young, Pinellas County Sheriff Bob Gualtieri, and Pasco County Sheriff Chris Nocco.
